Course Content

This programme will equip you with the skills and knowledge to enable you to take on the newly created role of practice assessor. It is designed to enable Allied Health Professionals from multiple clinical areas to supervise, support and assess learners in practice.

What will I learn?

The main focus of the learning is being able to put learning into practice back in the workplace. Learners will develop their skills as a mentor and ultimately be able to better advise, guide and supervise learners to ensure they acquire the most benefit from their learning programme. The Apprenticeship, will develop your communication and listening skills, coaching and feedback skills, assessment, leadership and reflection.

How will I be taught?

A variety of interactive learning methods are used including discussion, group work, reflection, clinical scenarios, workshops, peer learning, e-learning and simulation.

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed through through informal assessment of group discussions and Q&A during class. Formative assessment of progress towards the Learning Mentor Apprenticeship standards is carried out throughout the course and will be assessed in a portfolio format.

What can I do next?

Learners could progress further within their vocation specialism and/or into roles involving the assessment and coaching of vocational learners.

Is there anything else I need to know?

Learners will also complete a Level 1 Safeguarding qualification alongside their main programme of study.
