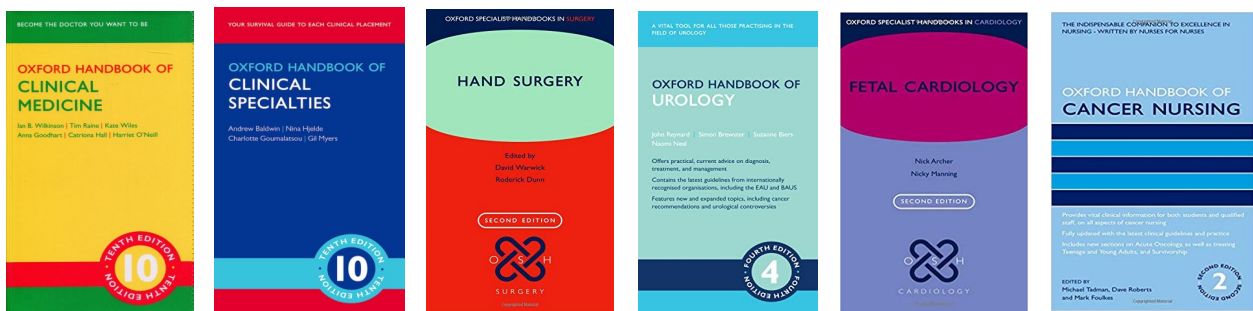

How to access the E-Books

Log in at home or on a trust PC

1) Go to the website - <https://healthacademy.lancsteachinghospitals.nhs.uk/library>

- or go to the **Library homepage** on the Trust intranet

2) Click - **Find a book** on the home page.

Search our catalogue for print and e-books, browse for e-books by subject, suggest and review books, and find out about our pop-up library service.

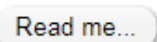

3) Type - **Oxford Handbook** or **Oxford Specialist Handbook** into the search box and click eBooks.

How to read a book online or download a book to read offline

Taking a history

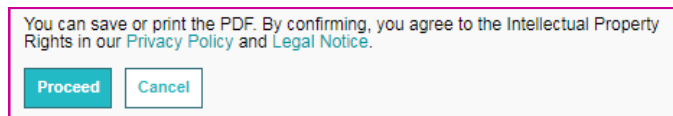
Taking a good history is an art and an essential skill: 80% of diagnoses should be made on history alone, with the signs you elicit adding an extra 10% and tests only giving the final 5% or so. Do not rely on signs or investigations for your diagnosis, but use them rather to confirm what you suspected. Try to put the patient at ease: a good rapport may relieve distress. Introduce yourself and check whether the patient is comfortable. Be conversational rather than interrogative. Start with open questions, allow the patient to tell their story, but if they stray off topic, gently steer them back towards the important points.

2) Download a Chapter

- Click your desired chapter.

- Once you are in the desired chapter, you will have the option to download it.

- You need to click **proceed** to be able to download the chapter.



- The chapter will be downloaded onto your computer as a **PDF** document (**PLEASE NOTE:** Adobe Reader is required to read PDFs)

How to save resources

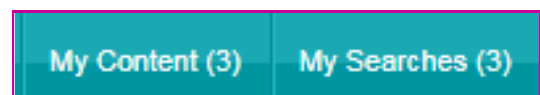
Create a Personal Profile

If you create a '**Personal Profile**' then you can save content and save searches for your future visits.

- To save a book, click the save icon which is in the top-right corner.



- You can then access these by going into your *personal profile* and clicking **my content** or **my searches**.



Please note - If the E-book has the green unlocked padlock then you will have access to it, if it has the purple locked padlock then you do not have access to it
