Quick guide to Harvard referencing

If you are writing for publication in a journal, please refer to any submission guidelines for authors, usually available on the journal website.

Books with a single author

Ellis, P. (2016) *Understanding research for nursing students*. 3rd ed. London, Learning Matters.

Books with two authors

Whitaker, R. and Borley, N. (2016) Instant anatomy. 5th ed. Chichester, John Wiley & Sons.

Books with three or more authors

When referencing a book with three or more authors, add 'et al' after the first name to indicate the additional authors: Tait, D. et al (2016) *Acute and critical care in adult nursing*. 2nd ed. London, Learning Matters.

Books with an editor or editors

Dougherty, L. and Lister, S. (eds.) (2015) *The Royal Marsden manual of clinical nursing procedures*. 9th ed. Chichester, Wiley-Blackwell.

Chapter in an edited book

Pellatt, G. (2014) Caring for people with impaired mobility. In: Baillie, L. (ed.) *Developing practical nursing skills*, 4th ed. Boca Raton, Taylor & Francis Group.

Journal articles

Pinto-Carral, A. et al (2016) Patient-reported mobility: a systematic review. *Archives of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation*, 97 (7), pp.1182-94.

Guidelines

National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (2016) *Sepsis: recognition, diagnosis and early management*. London, NICE.

Reports

UK statutes (Acts of Parliament)

When referencing an act of Parliament you need to include the title of the act, the year it was published, the chapter number, place of publication and publisher (usually Her Majesty's Stationery Office):

Data Protection Act 1998. (c.29), London: HMSO.
