#### What is Pubmed?

PubMed provides **free** access to **MEDLINE**, a database of over 28 million citations covering the fields of medicine, dentistry, nursing and allied health.

## How do I access Pubmed?

To access Pubmed go to:

#### http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed

You can use the database straight away or create an account, which will allow you to save searches and collections.

## **Using Pubmed**

#### Basic Search - Quick but not always effective

Use this option for simple keyword searching. This is quick but a search may retrieve thousands of results.

#### Advanced Search - Most effective method

Use this option to undertake a more thorough search and to combine different search terms together using Boolean operators AND & OR.

### **Basic search**

To do a basic search, place your keyword(s) in the search box and click Search



## **Advanced search**

To do an advanced search, click on the Advanced link under the search box



The advanced search option allows you to undertake a more comprehensive search.

The most effective way to search PubMed is to search for each concept within your question separately, and then combine them together with the Boolean operators AND and OR.
