# **Learning Environment**

We would like to welcome you to your learning environment.

The Pharmacy department at our Trust has over 180 staff including Prescribing Pharmacists, Clinical Pharmacists, Pharmacy Technicians, Pharmacy Assistants, Clerical Staff and Trainee Pharmacists and Pre-registration Technicians. The service operates seven days a week providing dispensing services, pharmaceutical procurement/distribution and a clinical ward-based service to all areas. Pharmacy Patient Services is supported by Preston Pharmaceuticals which is is an NHS licenced pharmacy manufacturing unit incorporating non-sterile manufacturing, a radio pharmacy and a large aseptic unit, providing a comprehensive range of services to the Trust and other hospitals in the Northwest.

The Trainee Pharmacist Training Programme is delivered across the two hospital sites: Preston (a large specialist hospital) and Chorley (a smaller district general hospital). The structured rotational training programme consists of clinical pharmacy, automated dispensary services, clinical trials, mental health, non-sterile manufacturing, radiopharmaceuticals, aseptic and pharmacy procurement. The programme also includes comprehensive accuracy checking and medicines management training programmes. Clinical pharmacy training is provided across all clinical areas including medicine, surgery, neurology, paediatrics, burns and plastics, renal and oncology using set clinical objectives. During this training, set medicines management competencies must be achieved to enable the trainee to support pharmacy services operationally whilst under the supervision of a pharmacist. This provides experience the trainee will utilise and rely on after registration. There is a strong focus on education and training; the programme contains specialist training sessions on specific clinical subjects plus participation in the Regional Study Days. There are also opportunities to teach both medical students and pharmacy undergraduates. Cross Sector Experience in Community Pharmacy, Mental Health Services and GP practice is supported. The Trainee Pharmacists will form part of the pharmacy team contributing to and supporting the department agenda and transformation plans.







### Induction

The Local Induction process will take place throughout the first week of your placement.

This will comprise of:

- Trust and department orientation, including housekeeping information
- Location of emergency equipment
- IT access
- Reading & acknowledgement of Mandatory Trust policies such as Health & Safety, Fire Safety, Infection Control, Information Governance, Staff Code of Conduct, Social Networking and Dress Code policies.
- Adult Basic Life Support training if applicable
- Trust Moving & Handling Training if applicable
- COVID-related policies & procedure
- Orientation
- Professional voice: freedom to speak up, datix, chain of command, open door policy
- An awareness of our Educational Governance Team- evaluation and importance of feedback
- Inter-professional Learning Sessions
- Practice Assessment Record and Evaluation (PARE) training, if applicable
- Collaborative Learning in Practice (CLiP™), if applicable
- How the role of Practice Development Facilitator can support you, where applicable







# What to bring on your first day

# **Inter-professional Learning Sessions and eLearning Resources**

At our Trust, our Education Team facilitates a yearly programme of Inter-professional Learning (IPL) sessions. This programme consists of various teaching sessions, delivered by our Specialist Teams, to support and enhance our learners and trainees' learning experience with us.

Inter-professional learning is an important part of your development and allows you to build professional relationships and communication skills with the wider multidisciplinary teams. Our IPL sessions are valuable in supporting you to stretch your knowledge and experiences to enhance your clinical practice. They also help bridge the gap between theory and practice, allowing you to hold a deeper understanding of the topics discussed. Our sessions are open for all learners and trainees on placement at our Trust to attend and these learning opportunities are an extension to your learning environment; therefore, these hours need to be recorded on your timesheets. We encourage our staff to facilitate enabling a learner/trainee to attend these sessions.

Please note: You must inform your learning environment prior to attending a session. These IPL sessions need to be discussed in a timely manner with your learning environment.

You are required to complete a reflection on each of your IPL sessions, as well as documenting on your HEI documentation what you have learnt and how this relates to your current placement.
