## Meet Brittany Mollart...

Double award winning Brittany Mollart is a shining example of how an Apprenticeship can help transform a young person’s life.

Brittany joined the Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust at the age of 17 as a Level 2 Apprentice in Business Administration. After only months in the role, she was soon described as “an invaluable asset to the organisation” by her manager. Brittany’s effort and commitment over the one year programme was further recognised when she beat 1,000 other young people regionally to win the Preston’s College Apprentice of the Year Award in 2015.

This was soon followed by the Apprentice of the Year at the Lancashire Business View Young’uns Awards. Hosted at Blackpool’s Winter Gardens, the award celebrated the young entrepreneurial, professional and business talent that the county has to offer.

Following her Apprenticeship, Brittany studied a Level 3 Award in Education & Teaching with Preston’s College and was given a full-time role as Widening Participation Support Officer with the Trust. Brittany now looks after all the new Apprentices currently following in her footsteps. Talking about how an Apprenticeship provides invaluable experience, that couldn’t be equalled in a classroom,

Brittany said: “Being an Apprentice has been so worthwhile for me and I would urge every young person to look into completing an Apprenticeship to help get their foot in the door. “My advice would be to push yourself to always go above and beyond their duties.”

Brittany has subsequently continued to grow achieving her PTTLS awards and clinching a promotion to Widening Participation Tutor in 2017. She has also won the award for ‘Most Inspirational Person’ at the recent Our People Awards at Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust.
